

Preface

During the period of NR/SR Bosnia & Herzegovina (1945-1992) thousands of monuments commemorating the People's Liberation War, Struggle and Movement (commonly referred to in abbreviated form as NOR, NOB and NOP - henceforth collectively referred to as NOB) were created and unveiled on its territory. In recent decades, these monuments to the NOB have often become forgotten, ignored, or exposed to unquantifiable damage. The reasons for this 'unquantifiability' stem, in part, from the lack of a comprehensive recording system¹ among and between stakeholders² during the period of SRBiH, and the destruction of archives of stakeholders during the 1992-95 war and its immediate aftermath, but have been inarguably exacerbated by the administrative system in Bosnia & Herzegovina in the present day.

This paper aims to give a brief overview of the current situation of monuments to the People's Liberation War, Struggle and Movement on the territory of Jezero municipality, in the Republika Srpska entity.

Background and Summary

The present-day municipality of Jezero was created from a part (approximately 18%) of the pre-1992 municipality of Jajce. It is located in the Republika Srpska entity, while the remainder of Jajce today lies within Central Bosnia Canton, in the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Between 1966 and 1973, the most comprehensive nationwide survey of immovable monuments to the NOB to date was carried out under the auspices of the Republic Institute for the Protection of Monuments. However, it was not until 1981 that a summary of this survey list was published (Tihić, 1981). In total, 2,049 immovable properties were recorded on the territory of SR Bosnia & Herzegovina, with 29 being recorded on the territory of then-Jajce municipality in a survey conducted between 10 and 15 September 1968, categorized as follows:

- **Memorial plaques – 18**
- **Memorial busts – 2**
- **Fountains, wells and cisterns – 0**
- **Artistic monuments – 4**
- **Identified individual graves and mass graves – 0**
- **Graveyards for Partisans and Victims of Fascist Terror – 5**

Although the construction of memorials and monuments continued long after this period (with a wave of monuments being created in the wake of the death of Josip Broz Tito, and continuing throughout the 1980s), no further Republic-level survey of monuments was undertaken before the secession of Bosnia and Herzegovina from Yugoslavia in 1992.

Prior to the creation of this list, however, the NOB heritage of Jajce municipality was the subject of two published papers; Šefik Bešlagić's *Spomenici narodnooslobodilačke borbe u Jajcu i njihova zaštita* (*Monuments to the People's Liberation Struggle in Jajce and their preservation*) (1958) and Perko Vojinović's *Spomen ploče iz NOB-e i partizanska groblja u Jajcu i okolini* (*Memorial plaques to commemorate the NOB and Partisan cemeteries in Jajce and its surroundings*) (1969). These publications, in addition to providing tangible information on the existence of a large number of monuments and memorials within Jajce municipality, also in some cases provide terminus post and ante quem for the creation of monuments and memorials, where no more specific information can be found. Within the boundaries of the present-day Jezero municipality, a total of 4 monuments were documented by these two publications. These are as follows:

No sites protected at the Republic level in SRBiH relating to the NOB on the territory of the present-day Jezero municipality are listed in the Federal Institute for Statistics' documentation *Zaštićena Graditeljska Baština Jugoslavije* (*Protected Built Heritage of Yugoslavia*) (Savezni Zavod za Statistiku, 1982), and Jezero municipality has no published spatial plan as of the time of writing.

This cemetery in its current layout was created in 1983, although its author is unknown. However, the site certainly predates this, and is mentioned in Vojinović (1969, p.226), where it is stated that – according to documentation created during a survey of burial sites within the municipality – in 1964 the cemetery contained 8 Partisan fighters buried in individual graves and 210 Victims of Fascist Terror buried in 5 mass graves. On the same page, Vojinović also states that by the time of his writing the cemetery contained 8 graves (5 of which were ‘fully complete’, presumably meaning they included a headstone with information to identify the individual buried) of Partisan fighters, alongside 5 mass graves containing 279 individuals, with grave markers. The cemetery was enclosed by a wooden fence, and contained poplar and false acacia trees.

Today the site consists of a series of different elements. At the front (south) lies a whitewashed cuboidal structure, flanked by two white planters, inscribed with 60 names. Behind this lies a line of 5 cubic blocks, each inscribed with the names and basic information of individual fallen fighters. Behind these lie a total of 10 whitewashed concrete panels, with a concave shape, supported by concrete pedestals. These panels are arranged in an arc-like pattern, and are either individual or coupled together, in a 2-1-1-2-1-1-2 formation. Behind the central panels lies a large false acacia tree, slightly off-centre. In total, 622 names are written on these panels, with almost all (610 in total) being names of individuals killed in 1941 (a total of 12 have a date of death inscribed as 1942).

Names throughout the cemetery are inscribed upon metal (most likely bronze or another copper alloy) plaques, held to the concrete structures by metal rails, in a ladder-like structure (see Figure 1d).

There is no description relating to whom each of the three elements commemorates, and the only dedication within the cemetery can be seen on one of the rear panels, which reads (in the Cyrillic alphabet, as is the same for all other inscriptions in the cemetery) as follows:

PALIM BORCIMA I ŽRTVAMA FAŠISTIČKOG TERORA
SAVEZ UDRUŽENJA BORACA
NARODNO OSLOBODILAČKOG RATA
JAJCE - NOVEMBAR 1983⁴

However, due to the ages of the individuals commemorated on each of the panels and information provided by Vojinović relating to the cemetery's earlier layout, it can be assumed that the front panel commemorates fallen fighters from the vicinity who are not buried at the site, the five individual blocks commemorate the five known fallen fighters buried here, and the large concrete panels to the rear commemorate Victims of Fascist Terror. It could not be determined during the course of this research whether all of those commemorated on these panels are buried at this site, or if the panels merely commemorate those who were killed in the surrounding area.

A full list of inscriptions can be seen in Annexes A, B & C of this report. It must be noted here, however, that a number of dates of birth of fallen fighters on the panel at the front of the cemetery do not correspond with those given in *Jajačko područje u Oslobođilačkom Ratu i Revoluciji 1941-1945* vols. I & II (1981, pp.603-610; 1983, pp.549-557). It has not been possible to determine which of the two sources (i.e. the cemetery plaques or the books) contains the correct data during the course of this research.

Behind the arc of panels lies a graveyard which is still in use today. It must be noted that although Vojinović claimed that the cemetery covered an area of 7000m², today it covers an area of between roughly 4000m² and 4500m².

The cemetery is in relatively good condition, although some of the cubic structures marking the graves of individual partisan fighters have deteriorated to an extent, and a small number of bronze inscriptions have disappeared. This is more likely to be the result of weathering or unintentional damage than concerted vandalism or theft, as the panels overwhelmingly survive in good condition. Although on initial visits to the cemetery in April and May 2019, it appeared to be regularly maintained, the area was observed to be relatively heavily overgrown on a follow-up visit made by Aida Zulum in September 2019. Furthermore, detritus from vegetation (primarily fallen leaves and fruit casings) has accumulated on a number of the panels in the recess behind the names.

This plaque lies in the settlement of Jezero, alongside the M5 road, which connects Bihać and Sarajevo. Its date of creation and author are unknown. The plaque commemorates the site of execution of 197 Victims of Fascist Terror in 1941, and consists of a small stone base with a concrete

stela atop it, into which a white stone plaque is set, surrounded by an enclosure made of iron fencing with a small gateway. The inscription upon the plaque (in the Latin alphabet) reads as follows:

NA OVOM MJESTU JE NEPRIJATELI
1941. GODINE STRIJELJAO NEVINIH
DIECE, MAJKI I OTACA 197.
*O.O.S.B.N.O.R-A JEZERO*⁵

A five-pointed star lies above the inscription.

While – as stated above – the date of this plaque's creation is unknown, the use of the abbreviation 'SBNOR' as opposed to the later-used 'SUBNOR' gives a *terminus ante quem* for the memorial plaque of 1962, when the 'U' (for '*Udruženja*' = 'Associations') was added to reflect the organization's expanded mandate.⁶

The enclosure, base and stela are in relatively good condition. The plaque, however, bears damage between the star and inscription, possibly caused by a bullet or heavy sharp implement, although this does not affect the readability of the text. Further, it would appear as if the text has possibly been covered over at some point during the past, as ingrained dirt that has affected the rest of the plaque has not affected the text, and there appears to be a clear delineation, as if caused by intentional covering. The dates and reasons for this (if any) could not be ascertained during the course of research.

This plaque lay on (or close to) a house alongside the Pliva lake, in the village of Žaovine (also known locally as Žaljvine). However, Vojinović (1969, p.223) claimed that the house lay in the settlement of Jezero itself. At the time of his writing, the property belonged to Pero Trivunčić. The plaque commemorated the place of execution of 63 Victims of Fascist Terror. Its author and date of

unveiling are unknown. Today, the house lies in ruins, and there is no visible sign of the plaque, although, due to the amount of overgrowth and the general state of decay of the property, this is not to say that it does not survive. Vojinović (1969, p.223) provides a transcription of the plaque, which reads as follows:

NA OVOM MJESTU JE NEPRIJATELJ STRELJAO
ZATIM POKLAO I ZAPALIO 63 NEVINA GRAĐANA.

*O.O.S.B.N.O.R-A JEZERO*⁷

The formatting – and also the script – employed in the inscription are unknown. It is also worth noting that while Vojinović transcribed the plaque as saying ‘STRELJAO’, it may well have been inscribed ‘STRIJELJAO’, as is the case with the plaque to commemorate the site of execution of 197 Victims of Fascist Terror documented above (pp.9-10), for which he mis-transcribed this word. Furthermore, for reasons stated above (p.10), the use of the abbreviation ‘SBNOR’ gives a *terminus ante quem* for the memorial plaque of 1962.

Although this monument appears to *de jure* lie upon the territory of the neighbouring Jajce municipality, it has been included in this report due to the fact that at the time of its creation it lay upon the territory of the (former) Jezero municipality, which was absorbed into the larger Jajce municipality at some point between 1953 and 1961 (most likely during 1955 reforms in self-government; see Pejanović (2014) for further details) and for reasons of expediency.

This memorial plaque lies in the settlement of Ljoljići. It was unveiled in 1952, although its author is unknown. The plaque sits on a base made of tufa (a stone commonly found in the surrounding area), and is set into a stela also seemingly made of tufa, but covered in a grey plaster or cement.

The plaque commemorates the location of the formation of the Simo Šolaja Battalion in September 1942, named after Simo Šolaja (1906-1942), a famed Partisan fighter hailing from the village of Pljeva in nearby Šipovo municipality, who was killed in battle the month prior to the battalion's establishment. It is inscribed (in the Cyrillic alphabet) as follows:

*U OVOM SELU SEPTEMBRA 1942 GODINE
FORMIRAN JE I UDARNI BATALJON
“SIMO ŠOLAJA”
U ZNAK SJEĆANJA NA FORMIRANJE TOG SLAVNOG
BATALJONA PODIŽE SE OVA SPOMEN PLOČA
15.IX.1952
SRESKI ODBOR SAVEZA BORACA
JAJCE⁸*

The memorial plaque is in relatively good condition, with the inscription clearly legible, although a large crack runs through its centre. The stela and base are in need of repair, and both bear evidence of weathering (not uncommon with this stone type), with other damage also visible on the right side of the stela, possible from some kind of impact. Furthermore, there is evidence of red graffiti having been sprayed on the stela at some point in the past, immediately below the plaque. There appears to be no maintenance undertaken on or around the monument, with vegetation growing from the pores within the tufa, particularly in the lower courses of the base.

It must be noted that, while the plaque claims that this site was the location of the formation of the Simo Šolaja Battalion, an account given by Simo Popadić in *Jajačko područje u Oslobođilačkom Ratu i Revoluciji 1941-1945* vol. II (1983, pp.398-399) claims that the battalion was formed in the vicinity of the village of Pljeva, some 12 kilometres to the south-west of Ljoljići. This gives rise to questions about the authenticity of the location, which could only be answered through further research.

Current Situation – Summary

Four monuments and memorials to the NOB were identified from literary sources as having existed on the territory of Jezero municipality (one cemetery and three memorial plaques). Their condition can be summarized as follows:

The **memorial cemetery of Victims of Fascist Terror and Partisan Fighters in Jezero** is in good condition. Although it appears to be well cared for and maintained, further efforts are needed to reduce encroachment by overgrowth in the summer and autumn months. The idea of restoring or replacing the central cuboidal block elements in the long term should be considered, as should replacement of all missing metal elements. In terms of research, it should be determined whether this is the burial site of all of those whose names are inscribed upon the panels, or if some of the inscriptions on the panels instead merely commemorate those who fell.

The **plaque to commemorate the site of execution of 197 Victims of Fascist Terror in Jezero** survives and is in relatively good condition. However, the plaque itself should be cleaned, and the legibility of the inscription improved by infilling the letters using a suitable material. Occasional monitoring of the site is recommended to ensure that no damage occurs and the condition of the plaque and stela does not deteriorate.

The **plaque to commemorate the murder of 63 Victims of Fascist Terror in Žaovine** could not be located during the research undertaken for this report. That is not to say, however, that it no longer exists. Further research is needed to determine whether it does, in fact, still survive on this property, and, if not, the idea of creating a new marker with greater historical context of the event should be considered.

The **plaque to commemorate the formation of the Simo Šolaja Battalion in Ljoljići** is in need of cleaning. An assessment of its condition should be undertaken, and, in the longer term, the legibility of the inscription improved by infilling the letters using a suitable material. Occasional maintenance of the site and monitoring of the condition of the memorial plaque and stela is also recommended. From a research perspective, efforts should be made to determine whether this is, in fact, a monument memorializing an ‘authentic place’, and, if not, the reasons behind this memorial plaque being erected at this location.
